Goals for your First Year: Transition and adjust to college academics.

- Establish healthy self-care routines.

- Identify one-on-one campus support service available to help during personally or academically challenging times.
- Connect with one or two classmates in each course to form study groups or seek supplemental support with the Teaching + Learning Commons.
- Submit questions via the VAC any time you have concerns about your academic progress.
- In winter quarter, review your major's Four Year Plan and develop an academic plan with your major department and College Academic Advisors.

- Declare a major before you reach 90 units.
- Take advantage of the Coffee-with-a-Prof program.
- If you are planning to study abroad, start planning early.
- Explore internships, research, and/or job opportunities.
- Learn about your upper division requirements and contact academic advisors if you have questions.
- Become involved in co-curricular activities to enhance your Co-Curricular Record.
- Assess your personality, interests, and skills and how they might apply to your potential careers.
- Meet with your college academic advisors to evaluate progress on general education and university requirements.
 - Meet with your major department to determine your interest and progress in your major.

THIRD/TRANSFER YEAR AT A GLANCE

- If interested in graduate programs, utilize the Career Center to discuss post-graduate plans.
- Maintain contact with favorite professors to explore career options and receive mentorship.
- Continue to build leadership skills by applying for internships, research, and/or study abroad opportunities.
- Prepare & plan when to take graduate/professional school admission exams, if needed.
- Boost curiosity by learning new skills and hobbies.
- Network by meeting with professionals in career fields of interest.
- Explore options for independent research through a favorite professor, your major department, or find opportunities on the REAL portal.
- Review your academic plan and degree audit with your major department and college academic advisors.
